Learning Bulletin – Construction Fatality Heathrow Airport – Non Thames Water

What Happened?

In 2014 an incident occurred which resulted in a man being fatality crushed between two vehicles. The individuals involved in the incident were brothers working on a night shift.

Why did it really happen?

The operatives were tasked with moving a broken-down scissor lift, but while reversing the dumper truck, the drivers foot got stuck between the brake and the accelerator and collided with an operative who was standing in-between the two vehicles. Following the investigation neither operatives were fully trained to undertake the work and the task was not properly overseen or managed. The construction company was fined £800,000 by the HSE following the incident.

What can I do differently?

- All fixed and mobile plant must only be operated by trained and competent operators — Only operate the plant if you have complete understanding of the operating procedures
- Ensure all tasks have been Risk Assessed and there is a SSOW in place everyone involved must be briefed on how to undertake the task safely
- Always ensure there is adequate supervision in place
- Never work outside of your safe system of work Always consult your supervisor!
- Zero compromise If you are unsure that the method is the safest way to complete the task, ask your supervisor and challenge. Ensure you fully understand the Safe System of Work before proceeding
